

What drives the price of fuel in my area?

- Gulf Coast Platts Pricing?
 - This is the biggest driver in what we pay for wholesale fuel.
 - Gulf Coast Platts can loosely be defined as the price at which large refiners in Houston, and to a smaller extent along the Gulf Coast, are able to sell fuel for injection into the pipeline systems.

 Question: What does Houston have to do with what I pay for fuel here????






Refined Products Pipelines

Pricing Summary

- The main driver of pricing is the refinery output sale price followed by:
 - Pipeline Transportation Costs
 - Terminal Costs
 - Trucking Costs
 - Retail Margins



SLC Historic Fuel Prices

- Summer of 2019 Highway \$2.539 & Off-Road \$2.109 – Per gallon
- 2020 (days before election) Highway \$1.799
 & Off-Road \$1.449 Per gallon
- 6/22/22 (Highest Average) Highway \$5.409
 & Off-Road \$4.899 (Some Stations \$6 plus) (+201% & 238%)
- Highest during surge = Chillicothe, Oh \$6.09
- Current Highway=\$4.067/Off-Road=\$3.691 (still up 126% & 154%) (Hi - \$4.47/Lo - \$3.89)

Surging Fuel Prices!

- Everyone! It works its way down to the consumer regardless of whether they are buying lumber, paper, or a box of cereal at the grocery store.
- We are obviously talking about loggers and those that transport forest products. At least 90% of the SLC members are loggers and or forest products truckers.
- The FRA's Eric Kingsley stated "As is obvious to anyone in the forest industry, loggers and truckers are the supply chain link that connects the woods to the mill. If loggers aren't healthy, it's hard for any other sector to be healthy very long."

Who is it Hurting?

Fuel Brokering

- How does the SLC help the Logging Industry?
 - We use brokers that shop EACH rack to determine the best fuel price structure among the racks
 - Those brokers then monitor pricing information at the racks to ensure that we are buying at a competitive *delivered* price
 - Unlike the others, Southern Loggers is not a textbook retailer. We are technically a "for profit" business that functions as a "non-profit". Therefore our "profit" is only measured in the help we provide to our industry.

- **Big Movements**! We have watched our market prices move anywhere from 50 80 cents per day at times.
- **Trends** in the fuel business tend to be all over the place and tend to last hours and days....not months.
- Ukraine/Russia? Not exactly. ALC Survey prior to Russia's invasion of Ukraine showed that 50% of loggers were already showing a 50% increase in fuel costs. Our average prices were already up 96% & 111%.
- The rapid rise in fuel costs does not stop with fuel. It increases the cost of every other item associated with operating your logging or trucking business.

Market Movements/Trends

Market Movements

- (6/22/22) Highest Average \$5.40
- (8/15/22) Average Down to \$4.03
- (9/1/22) Average Up to \$4.58
- (9/20/22) Average Down to \$4.21
- (9/26/22) Average Down to \$4.06

- Timing takes a ton of effort and practically an army of staff to do so on the level that we must time it. (Brokers)
- Timing is virtually impossible without the ability to store fuel in large tanks (15,000 gallons+).
- Timing is EVERYTHING, especially when the market is making big moves in broad sweeps regardless of whether the market is moving upward or downward.

Timing

- Who knows?! At one time we thought we were able to do a little speculating. That has all changed.
- Good news for now!!! Over the past 3 weeks our average prices have <u>dropped</u> \$0.52/gallon on Highway Fuel and \$0.46/gallon on Off-Road Fuel.
- Demand has ramped up since the country has opened back up. Domestic inventory for crude oil and domestic inventory is down due to lack of production. Although we have seen significant decreases, our fear is that we are headed for continued elevated fuel prices.
