White-nose Syndrome Facts

- ► White-nose Syndrome (WNS) is a fungal disease from Eurasia that originally was detected in a cave in New York state in 2006
- ► Causes bats to wake from itching and they starve to death when they normally sleep all winter
- Now occurs in 37 states and all Canadian Provinces out to British Columbia in North America
- Northern long-eared bat populations have declined 97-100%
- ▶ WNS showed up in western NC around 2012, 6 years after it was initially discovered in New York.
- Prior to WNS, Northern long-eared bats were very common in western North Carolina
- Other local bat species with severe declines are: Indiana bat, little brown bat, and tri-colored bat

Northern long-eared bat Endangered status becomes official March 31st
